Stepping back in Time on a Steam Locomotive

Nostalgic steam locomotives (SL) still run between Kanaya and the upper reaches of the Oi River. A journey along the wide river with its rustic scenery, whistles echoing in the mountains - unforgettable memories are formed. Take the time to relax at a hot spring enroute - bliss.

Shin-Kanaya Station 4-1

This retro-flavored station often appears in movies and dramas. The station yard is like a railway museum with an exhibition of old passenger cars and trains.



You can find a turntable that reverses the direction of the popular Oigawa steam locomotive at Shin-Kanaya Station on the Oigawa Railway Line. You may have a look at a steam locomotive before departure.

Changes of the stream of the Oi River created the pond. Nomori Park is good for nature walks and the water of the footbath in the park (brought from Kawane hot spring) is open in the afternoon on weekends.

levama's Cherry Blossoms Tunnel

Kawane is well-known in Shizuoka Prefecture for its cherry blossoms with this tunnel of cherry blossoms being the highlight. The 1-kilometer-long (approx. 0.65 mile) street which runs parallel with Oigawa Railway is covered by a light pink tunnel. When combined with the steam locomotive, it creates a great view.



Sasama Nature Center

Located in the beautiful mountain countryside, this former elementary school has been renovated to serve as a community center focussing on hands-on learning and youth programs. It can also be utilized for various sports training camps and cultural programs.
